More than 120 students from around the world will share the richness of their diverse cultures in two family-friendly performances of Lawrence University's 42nd annual International Cabaret.

Representing more than 30 countries, Lawrence students showcase their native heritage through dance, music and fashion in performances at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, April 7 and 3 p.m. Sunday, April 8 in Stansbury Theatre of the Music-Drama Center. A free reception follows Sunday's performance in the Warch Campus Center. This year's theme – "The Realm of Unity" – reflects the organizers belief that it is our differences that actually unite us.

Tickets, at \$10 for adults, \$5 for students and children (free for children 4 and under), are available through the Lawrence Box Office, 920-832-6749. In addition to its normal hours, the box office will be open one hour prior to Sunday's performance.

Cabaret features 15 acts and two fashion shows of colorful, native dress. Among the performances will be a traditional Greek folklore dance, an acoustic rendition of a modern Nepalese rock song, a mariachi band, a Croatian song, an Eastern Arab dance, a traditional and a modern Japanese dance, a popular love song from Ecuadorian folklore and the always popular, high-energy series of South Korean K-pop dances.
