



Free Tax Help Available to Fox Valley Residents

Fox Valley residents with low or moderate incomes can receive free help in filing their electronic federal and state income tax returns.

The service, offered by AARP Foundation Tax-Aide volunteers in cooperation with the IRS and Wisconsin Department of Revenue, is available from January 30th through April 15th. Last year, Tax-Aide volunteers assisted over 2200 area taxpayers and their families.

Volunteers work with clients to prepare and file their returns. Taxpayers should bring all of their 2018 tax documents. Those interested in applying for the Wisconsin Homestead Credit should also bring their 2018 property tax bill or original 2018 Rent Certificate. Photo identification and Social Security documentation are also required.

Appointment-only sites will be open at the Neenah Library, 240 E. Wisconsin Ave, Thursdays from 11:30 am to 4:00 pm; at the Appleton Library, 225 N. Oneida St, Tuesdays 9:15 am to noon as well as 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm; at the Menasha Public Library, 440 First St. Menasha, Wednesdays 8:00 to noon; at the Kaukauna Public Library, 207 Thilmany Rd Ste 200, Kaukauna, Wednesdays 12:15 pm to 4:00 pm; at the Little Chute Community Center, 625 Grand Ave, Little Chute, Fridays 8:30 am to 1:00 pm; and at the Goodwill Center, 1800 Appleton Rd., Menasha, weekdays 8:15 am to noon.

Taxpayers previously served at the Menasha Senior Center will now be assisted at the Menasha Public Library where service will be offered by appointment.
